


Vegvísir—**Viking Compass**

The Huld Manuscript, written in Iceland by Geir Vigfusson in 1860, showed the vegvísir alongside a number of other galdrastafir (magical staves). The text states:

"Beri maður stafi þessa á sér villist maður ekki í hríðum né vondu veðri þó ókunnugur sá." "Carry this with you and you won't get lost in storms or bad weather".

This was the first documented appearance of the vegvísir. However, the Viking Age, which ran approximately 793-1066, was much earlier, so this probably is not a "true" Viking symbol.

The Vikings mostly used the sun to navigate. A theory exists that the solstein (sunstone) had a polarizing attributes and was used as a navigational instrument by the Viking Age. A stone found in 2002 off Alderney, in the wreck of a 16th-century



warship, may lend evidence of the existence of solsteins as navigational devices. The Rauðúlfs þáttr — which contains a story about Olav Haraldsson II, circa 995-1030—mentions the solstein:

Veður var þykkt og drífanda sem Sigurður hafði sagt. Þá lét konungur kalla til sín Sigurð og Dag. Síðan lét konungur sjá út og sá hvergi himin skýlausan. Þá bað hann Sigurð segja hvar sól mundi þá komin. Hann kvað glöggt á. Þá lét konungur taka sólarstein og hélt upp og sá hann hvar

geislaði úr steininum og markaði svo beint til

sem Sigurður hafði sagt.

The weather was thick and snowy as Sigurður had predicted. Then the king summoned Sigurður and Dagur (Rauðúlfur's sons) to him. The king made people look out and they could nowhere see a clear sky. Then he asked Sigurður to tell where the sun was at that time. He gave a clear assertion. Then the king made them fetch the solar stone and held it up and saw where light radiated from the stone and thus directly verified Sigurður's prediction.

Classic Norwegian Potato Salad—Potetsalat

Serves about 6 (as a side dish) - adapted from articgrub.com

2 ½ lbs potatoes

1-2 tbsp Dijon mustard

Juice of 1 large lemon, or more to taste

2 celery sticks, chopped fine

2 handfuls of fresh dill, choppedplus some for garnish


½ cup mayo

¼ cup pickle juice

5-6 dill pickles, minced

½ small red onion, chopped fine

Sea salt & cracked black pepper to taste



- 2. In a large mixing bowl, whisk together mayo, Dijon mustard, pickle juice, and lemon juice. Add the pickles, celery, red onion, and dill, and combine well.
- 3. Dice the cooled potatoes into 1 -2 inch pieces, and add to the mixture. Season with salt and pepper, add more lemon juice, pickle juice, or mayo as you see fit.
- 4. Cover and place in refrigerator for two or more hours to let flavors blend.
- 5. Garnish with fresh dill sprigs.

Beef and Vegetable Stew (Brun Lapskaus)

Serves 4—adapted from northwildkitchen.com

2 tablespoons butter 2 tablespoons oil

1 ¾ pounds beef stewing meat, trimmed and cut into 1-inch (2 ½ cm) cubes

3 cups beef stock 1 large onion

1 ½ cups celery root or parsnip, peeled 2 large carrots, peeled,

2 cups potatoes, peeled 1 large leak, rinsed

Parsley, to garnish

- 1. Heat the butter and oil in a large frying pan. Add the beef and brown on each side, you may need to brown the beef in batches. Place the beef in a large pot and add the stock. Bring to a boil then lower the heat, cover, and simmer for 1 hour.
- 2. Chop all the vegetables into ½-inch (1 ½ cm) pieces, except the leeks which should be sliced thinly. Add the vegetables to the pot and return to a boil over medium -high heat. Cook uncovered for 20 minutes. Season with salt and pepper. Don't be tempted to add more liquid as the vegetables will cook down, resulting in a somewhat-thick stew.
- 3. Serve warm with flatbread or bread, and garnish with chopped parsley.

When buying tickets for the Syttnede Mai picnic or our Lutefisk dinner or even just making a lodge donation, the lodge's Zelle contact is Amber Gardner at 720-394-8304 or email her at treasurer@fjelldalen.com with questions.



What is Zelle:

Zelle is a money transfer service that is set up through most financial institutions. It pulls directly from your account to send money with no charge instantly (in most cases) to friends and family using their phone number or email address. They can also send money directly into your account using the contact method that is linked to your account through your online banking. Your financial institution should be able to help you enroll or answer any questions. Or go to https://zellepay.com.

How it works:

Behind the scenes on your online banking profile with a bank that participates in Zelle you'd link your phone number or email address to your account. This way, instead of providing people with account and routing numbers, you give them the contact information that you have linked in order to receive the money, which is a safer exchange of information.

Words of caution:

- Do not send money via Zelle to anyone you do not know. Zelle works like cash and rarely has dispute rights.
- Take the time to read the new recipient message and the "Enrolled as..." name displayed in the Zelle pop-up when transferring money to a new contact.
- The only piece of information that someone needs to send funds is a phone number or an email address. It's a red flag for anyone to ask for an account, card number, user ID, password, Social Security, etc.
- Scams abound, especially during the holiday season, so be wary and keep in mind that if a transaction sounds too good to be true, it probably is.
- Call your bank to report if you have fallen victim to Zelle fraud.





Two Live Vesterheim Museum Presentations, for District Six Members

I'm happy to let you know that the District Six Board is making two Live Vesterheim Museum presentations available to District Six members via Zoom, in September and October. Each presentation is under an hour, followed by a short Q & A. Below are the dates, times, and program description. The maximum number of devices we can have logged into each presentation is 100; so if you are able to watch with others, more of us can participate. We are allowed to record the presentation, so we will also be able to make it available to lodges and members. Presentation #1: The Power of Silver: Traditional Norwegian Jewelry

Date: Tuesday, September 19 (8 PM CDT, 7 PM MDT, 6 PM PDT)

Speaker: Laurann Gilbertson, Vesterheim Chief Curator

Program Description: For centuries, Norwegians have treasured the beauty of silver. Silver showed the prosperity of a family, and, according to folk belief, could cure sickness in humans and livestock, improve crops, and protect against storms and evil spirits. Brooches were more than simple shirt fasteners. This program describes different styles of silver brooches, jewelry, and the beliefs surrounding this powerful metal. Sign up

Presentation #2: The Norwegian 'Mayflower': The Voyage of the Restauration

Date: Tuesday, October 10 (8 PM CDT, 7 PM MDT, 6 PM PDT)

Speaker: Dale Goodman, Former Vesterheim Trustee

Program Description: In the period beginning in 1825 and for about 100 years following, nearly 40% of the population of Norway – more than 800,000 Norwegians – immigrated to the United States. Most of those immigrants came for "economic opportunity," but the first immigrants – known as the Sloopers of 1825 – came for religious freedom. The voyage



was three years in the planning by an alliance of Quakers and Haugean Lutherans. Beginning on July 4th, 1825, a 54-foot sloop named Restaurasjonen (The Restauration) took 52 passengers on a 98-day journey from Stavanger, Norway to New York City. This presentation follows the story from its roots (in the Napoleonic Wars), through the voyage itself, the reception in New York City, and finally to the first Norwegian settlement in the United States in Kendall, New York.
