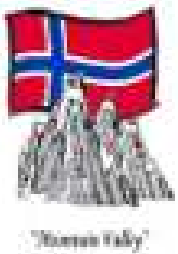

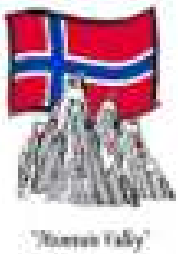

I was very happy to, once again, attend The Annual All Colorado Lodges Conference and Leadership (Zone 8) last month. This meeting was organized and facilitated by our District Six Director, Diane Molter, and hosted at Trollheim Lodge in Lakewood. This was a perfect chance to meet and network with other Colorado Lodge friends and share our ideas on many Lodge topics. These topics included such things as events, retention, community outreach, organizational updates, and much more. I will be incorporating a lot of information and ideas from this conference in our upcoming meetings.

We are taking nominations and volunteers to be one of our Fjelldalen Delegates to represent our Lodge at the upcoming District Six Sons of Norway Convention to be held at the Tuscany Suites Hotel and Casino, Las Vegas, Nevada June 21 – 23, 2024.

Every lodge within the district is entitled to two delegates for the lodge and one for every fifty members or major fraction thereof, based on the last semi-annual (membership) report prior to the election... Therefore, our Lodge is allowed up to five (5) delegates.

The election of these delegates must take place by March 31 before a district lodge meeting. At the same time, an equal or greater number of alternates may be elected to fill the seats of duly elected delegates prevented from attending the meeting. Also, guest passes are available at a reduced rate.

If you are interested in being a Fjelldalen Delegate, please let me or another board member know as soon as possible. A stipend (*TBD*) for this convention will be granted by our Lodge to each delegate to assist in covering your expenses.

That is not to say that this is a paid vacation and all free-time. The convention is a very busy undertaking, with events, meetings, and lectures packed into the short time period.

I was a Delegate for our Lodge at the convention two years ago and it really helped me understand and become connected to our organization and the SofN culture. I made a lot of great contacts and friends within our District and picked-up many ideas and tips that helped me in my Presidential journey.

I hope you will consider taking this opportunity to be a Fjelldalen Delegate.

We Need District 6 Delegate Volunteers

Fjelldalen Lodge will 5 delegates to the District Convention in Las Vegas: June 20-24, 2024, Tuscany Suites and Casino, Las Vegas, NV—see next page.

Fjelldalen usually provides some monetary assistance to offset the registration fee and the travel costs. The Convention gives attendees the opportunity to be involved in District actions and see what other lodges and the National group are doing.

Cost estimates are \$325 for registration, about \$800 for hotel, and your travel and food expenses. The lodge usually helps out with about \$500, but can't pay for all of it.

Fjelldalen can also send Alternates—no voting rights—but you get to attend all the events. Depending on how many delegates we are awarded and how many Lodge members volunteer, the stipend may not apply to alternates.

Tubfrim is Back!!!

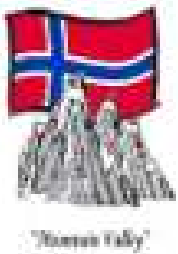
Start collecting your stamps! We are looking for a Tubfrim coordinator who will collect the stamps and forward them on—the Lodge will pay the shipping.

Cut the stamps from any mailing—leaving 1/4" beyond the stamp. Save them up and bring them to Lodge meetings.

Tuberculosis Stamp Store (later shortened to TUBFRIM) was established at Nesbyen in 1928. Postmaster Ditlef Frantzen took the initiative, and the purpose was to collect and sell used stamps for tuberculosis work among children in Norway.

Today, the profits go to health and well-being measures for children and adolescents in Norway, and to the fight against tuberculosis. The National Association for Public Health is the owner of TUBFRIM and distributes the profits.

In total, we have now distributed more than NOK 25 million in the form of TUBFRIM funds.

Greetings,

This is a reminder of the process for the election of delegates and alternates to the 2024 District Six Lodge Meeting and Convention. The notification of the number of delegates allowed for each lodge will be sent out in January 2024, after the year end membership reports are available. From the District Six Bylaws, Article V, paragraph 12: *Every lodge within the district shall be entitled to two delegates for the lodge and one for every fifty members or major fraction thereof, based on the last semi-annual (membership) report prior to the election.* From the Sons of Norway Charter and Bylaws, 14.6.2 – *Election of delegates must take place by March 31 before a district lodge meeting. At the same time, an equal or greater number of alternates may be elected to fill the seats of duly elected delegates prevented from attending the meeting, the first duly elected alternate filling the first vacancy, the second the next vacancy, etc.*

2024 District Six Convention at Tuscany Suites Hotel and Casino, Las Vegas, Nevada June 21 – 23, 2024

Thursday, June 20 – evening Board and Committee meetings

Friday, June 21 – Cultural Presentations and Workshops, Vendors, and evening President's Reception & Dinner – Viking Style

Saturday, June 22 – Leadership Workshops, Memorial Service, Opening Ceremony, District Lodge Meeting, Vendors, Folk Art Exhibition

Sunday, June 23– District Lodge Meeting, Recreation Center Meeting, Folk Art Exhibition, evening Installation of New Officers, Banquet and Awards

Monday, June 24 – morning meeting of the newly elected District Board of Directors, including outgoing board

Delegates are required to be in attendance for the entire Saturday and Sunday District Lodge Meeting sessions, and preferably for Friday President's Reception and Dinner, as well. Come early for the fun Viking/Cultural Sessions on Friday. Remember, any lodge member may attend as a guest. Check out the Convention website often as information is added periodically - 2024.sofn6.org

Costs are a key concern for delegates and lodges. Now might be the time to start a discussion about special fundraising to assist in sending delegates to the Convention. The delegate package is \$325 (\$275 if received and paid by April 15); guest package is \$285. Room costs at the Tuscany Suites Hotel and Casino are \$79 for Thursday and Sunday nights and \$179 for Friday and Saturday nights - plus 13.38% occupancy tax, roughly \$146.26 per night average if attending four nights. The \$79/night rate applies to pre/post reservations based on availability. Assistance with finding a roommate will be available – note such request on your registration form.

If you are running for a district office or otherwise planning on assisting in convention activities, you must notify your lodge so that you can be elected as a delegate. Attending a District Convention is fun and educational: you learn more about Sons of Norway; you are updated and informed about the state of District Six; you meet folks from other lodges; you gain insight from cultural sessions and leadership sessions; you help chart the course of our organization; and of course, you enjoy seeing wonderful entries in the Folk-Art Exhibition and the. Delegates come back enthused with new ideas to help lodges grow and thrive. Conventions are including more heritage and culture, but be assured, there's business to attend to as well. Next year's Convention will be full of fun, heritage, and culture as well as the business of our future. We hope to see you there.

Scandinavian vs. Nordic

What's the difference between "Scandinavian" and "Nordic?" Good question! For those outside of the region, the terms often get used interchangeably. However, if you look a little closer, you will discover that they are not one and the same.

- Geographically, Scandinavia refers to the peninsula that Norway, Sweden, and a small northern part of Finland sit on
- The most common use of the term Scandinavia refers to the three countries of Sweden, Norway, and Denmark which share geography, language, and history
- In general, speakers of Swedish, Norwegian, and Danish can understand each other well enough to communicate, because of the three languages' similarities
- Sámi people who live in Norway and Sweden may not identify as Scandinavian because of the complicated history of assimilation policies the countries had
- The term Nordic refers to five countries: Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Finland, and Iceland - and the autonomous regions those countries have jurisdiction over - the Faroe Islands, Greenland, and the Åland Islands
- Nordic countries are linked by cultural, historical, financial, and political influence on each other
- Nordic countries have a strong tradition of intergovernmental cooperation, with the foundation of the Nordic Council in 1952 that allowed citizens easy travel between the countries
- You won't hear people refer to themselves as "Nordic" because it's often seen as an added layer of their Norwegian, Swedish, Danish, Icelandic, or Finnish identity.

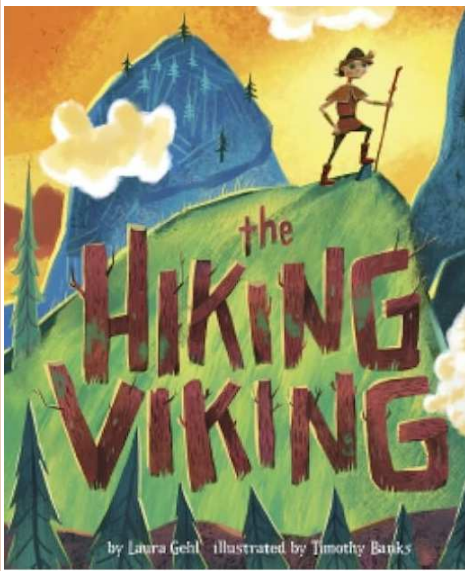
Fjelldalen's Hiking - Viking Club

Fjelldalen's Matklubb (Cooking Club)

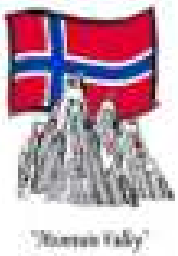
Matklubb meets at the Christ Lutheran Church's kitchen prior to our regularly scheduled Lodge Meetings on the second Saturday of the month.

Counties Go Separate Ways

In 2017, Norway's Storting voted to combine several fylker, and 19 counties became 11 regions in January of 2020. This administrative reform attempted to strengthen each region and improve coordination between municipalities, regions and state.

According to the website LifeinNorway.net, several of these combined regions decided that the set-up was not working and have rolled back the mergers as of January 1, 2024.

Now there are a total of 15 counties. Here is the current line-up of fylker:

Continuing as merged counties:

- Agder
- Vestlandet
- Trøndelag
- Innlandet

Splitting:

- Troms og Finnmark are breaking up
- Viken will revert to Buskerud, Akershus and Østfold counties
- Vestfold og Telemark will also roll back the changes

Unaffected by both 2020 and 2024 changes:

- Møre og Romsdal
- Nordland
- Oslo
- Rogaland

Not everyone was in favor of the restructuring, including the police service, who will need more resources and officers to cover the increased number of counties.

Sukkessterter med Sjokolade og Appelsin (Success Cake with Chocolate and Orange)

Serves 12

Ingredients For the base:

4 egg whites
150 g / 5.3 oz. chopped almonds, Leave the skins
90 g / 3 oz. chopped chocolate or chocolate chips

150 g / 5.3 oz. icing sugar or powdered sugar
1/2 tsp. baking powder

For the topping:

100 ml / 3.5 fl. oz. double or heavy cream
4 egg yolks
Grated rind of 1 orange

125 g / 4 oz. sugar
150 g / 5.3 oz. butter, at room temperature

To decorate:

A little melted chocolate
Thin strips of orange peel

1. Preheat the oven to 160°C / 320°F. Line the bottom of a 25 cm (about 10 inch) diameter springform cake pan with a circle of baking or greaseproof paper. There is no need to grease the tin.
2. Whisk the egg whites until they form stiff peaks.
3. Sift the icing sugar and baking powder together and stir in the almonds and chocolate.
4. Carefully fold this into the whipped egg white, taking care not to knock out too much air.
5. Pour into the prepared cake tin and smooth the top.
6. Bake in the center of the preheated oven for about 30 minutes. When it's cooked it'll be a nice rich golden brown and rebound slightly to a light touch. Remove from the oven and let cool completely before even attempting to remove springform.
7. Once cooled, run a blunt knife around the inside of the tin to loosen the cake. Place a plate on the top and tip the pan upside down. Lift the tin off and carefully peel off the baking paper. Place a serving plate on top of the cake and tip it back so it is the right way up.
8. Wash the ring part of the cake and slip it back over the cake to form a ring. Don't worry if you don't have a springform pan, simply make a ring shape from some foil and shape it around your cake to form a "wall."
9. To prepare the topping, put the cream, sugar and egg yolks into a pan and cook slowly over a low to medium heat stirring constantly. The mixture will gradually thicken and turn less opaque. You really do need to stir all the time or it will split. Try not to boil the mixture. It will take about 5 minutes.
10. Stir in the grated orange rind. Allow it cool for a minute or two before stirring in the butter a cube at a time. You will end up with a smooth, rich and shiny topping that is a beautiful golden color.
11. Pour the topping over the cake and gently tease it to the edges.
12. Put it in the fridge to cool and set for a couple of hours. When it's set, you can carefully remove the tin or foil from around it.
13. Decorate with melted chocolate and orange peel or however you like!

Blandaball – Mixed Dumplings A traditional dish from Møre.

4 servings

Ingredients:

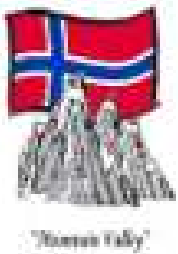
2.2 lbs / 1 kg fish fillets (preferably pollock, haddock or sole)
1 large onion
2 Tbsp. coarse barley

2 lbs / 900 g raw potatoes
1 Tbsp. salt 1/2 tsp. Pepper
2 Tbsp. Flour fried bacon crumbles

1. Cut the clean fish fillet into pieces. Peel and cut potatoes and onions into pieces. Shred fish, potatoes and onions in a meat grinder or food processor on coarse setting.
2. Stir salt, pepper and flour into the mixture. Form the mixture into round balls, and if desired, use your finger to make a hole and press pieces of bacon into the center of each ball.
3. Place the balls in simmering lightly salted water or fish stock, and let them simmer for 20-30 minutes. Check for done by dividing a ball in two to see if it is cooked through.
4. Serve blandaball hot with sides of fried bacon and turnips, rutabaga, carrot and/or potatoes. Leftovers can be pan-fried in slices or frozen.
